The importance of Salah

Salah is the most important component of our Islamic life. Every Muslim has to pray five times a day. It is necessary to pray on time as Allah Subhaanahu Wa Ta'ala said in the holy Quran, "Surely, Salah is an obligation on the believers that is tied up with time." (Surah an-Nisa, 103)

In the Noble Quran, Salah has been mentioned 109 times. In light it's importance, Rasulullah Sallallahu Alaihi Wasallam said: "The status of Salah in the Deen is like the status of the head in the body." (At-Targeeb wat-Tarheeb Lil Mundhiri, 1/246)

Abu Mas'ud Ansari (RTA) narrated that Jibreel Alaihis Salam came to the Prophet and asked him to stand and offer Salah. This was in the afternoon when the sun had moved past the zenith. The Messenger of Allah stood up and offered the four Rak'ats of Zuhr. Jibreel came to him when the length of the shadow was equal to the height of an object and told the Prophet to offer Salah. He prayed four Rak'ats of Asr. Jibreel came when the sun had set and he said to offer Salah. The Prophet offered three Rak'ats of Maghrib. Jibreel came when the twilight had disappeared and said to offer Salah. The Prophet offered four Rak'ats of Isha. Then Jibreel came at dawn and said to the Prophet to offer Salah. So he offered 2 Rak'ats of the morning Salah.
